Hiring Office: Purpose of consultancy:	Good sexual and reproductive health is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being in all matters relating to the reproductive system. It implies that people are able to have a satisfying and safe sex life, the capability to reproduce, and the freedom to decide if, when, and how often to do so.	
	When women and girls live a life free from violence, they can fully realize and exercise their sexual and reproductive health and rights. When young people have access to accurate information and services on sexual and reproductive health, they can make informed decisions about their bodies and lives. When population dynamics, shaped by people's sexual and reproductive health and choices, are used to inform policies, we can reach those furthest behind.	
	UNFPA Sri Lanka, with a grant in aid from the Government of Japan, will implement a three-year project to improve access to youth friendly SRH information and services, as well as promote SRHR of young people and women at the National level and the Provincial level targeting North, East, South and Central Provinces. This is an initiative between Japan and Sri Lanka for further implementation of the Women, Peace and Security agenda.	
	About the project:	
	The project will support the Government of Sri Lanka, specifically the Ministry of Health, Nutrition and Indigenous Medicine, Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Women and Child Affairs, and contribute to the realization of the Government's reconciliation agenda. In particular, this project will identify and improve SRH knowledge of community leaders, religious leaders, civil society and youth groups and service providers to facilitate attitudinal and behaviour changes. At the community level, the project will implement a public awareness and sensitization campaign to change perceptions about SRH. At the organizational level, the project will build capacity of service providers and organizations to ensure access to quality services. This will ensure that individuals have the right knowledge and attitude towards SRH and will respect each other's choices with regard to SRH and facilitate the access to services. Further the project will be supporting key NGO's to provide comprehensive and coordinated services for victims and survivors of SGBV.
