Purpose of consultancy:	The UNFPA 2018-2022 country programme will contribute to the equitable enjoyment of sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights of all Sri Lankans particularly among girls, women and young people. The Fund works towards the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) agenda through three transformative goals to 1. End unmet need for family planning 2. End preventable maternal deaths and 2. End sexual and gender based violence and harmful practices. Due to negative gender related norms and attitudes, women and girls are disproportionately affected, exacerbating existing gender inequalities and increasing the risk of SGBV and sexual exploitation and abuse.

As a part of this project, UNFPA in partnering with the local organisation is conducting a formative research to understand the drivers of Violence Against Women (VAW) upon finalization of the formative research UNFPA hope to develop a training module to address the current prevalent beliefs and behaviours.
